



Bike Lanes

We had a few incidents involving students using the bike lane. Please read the rules for motorists and cyclists below.



Rules for Motorists

It is illegal to park or stop your vehicle in a bicycle lane, or to drive in a bicycle lane unless:

- the lane is not in operation at the time
- you need to stop in an emergency
- you are crossing the bicycle lane to change lanes*
- you are entering or leaving the road from private property, a parking area or another road*
- you are overtaking a vehicle turning right or making a U-turn*
- you are avoiding an obstruction*
- you are driving a bus or a taxi that is picking up or dropping off passengers.

*When crossing or turning into a bicycle lane, drivers can only travel in the lane for 50 metres and must watch for and give way to bicycle riders.

Bicycle riders are allowed to move out of the bicycle lane to avoid an obstruction or to overtake another rider.

Minimum distance for passing cyclists

Drivers are required to give a minimum of one metre when passing a cyclist where the speed limit is 60km/h or less or 1.5 metres where the speed limit is over 60km/h.

Cyclists have less protection than motorists and are more likely to be injured if a crash happens, so they need adequate space when on the road. The rule applies to all types of vehicles including cars, motorbikes, trucks and buses when passing a cyclist.

If a driver has a clear view of any approaching traffic and can do so safely, they are permitted to:

- Drive to the right of the centre of the road
- Drive to the right of the dividing line
- Drive on a dividing strip that is at the same level as the road
- Drive on or over continuous lines around a painted island
- Straddle lanes
- Move across lanes
- Drive not completely in a single line of traffic.

Penalty for drivers is \$287 fine + \$60 victims of crime levy, and 2 demerit points.

Rules for Cyclists

- Watch for motorists and ride within the bicycle lane unless you need to avoid an obstruction or overtake another rider.
- When riding abreast of another rider, you must both be within the bicycle lane.

Church Hill

Please make your child/children aware that the Church Hill is private property and that climbing up and down the hill can be causing a safety issue with cars entering and leaving the car park.
